





Lara's brother Wolf, the beloved youngest of five siblings in a spirited, free-thinking family, leaves his college dormitory at the age of eighteen and disappears without a trace.

Six months after Wolf's departure, his body is discovered in a forest in the far north of Sweden. Taped under his clothes is a Moleskine diary chronicling his final journey to the Northern Lights.

Ten years later, Lara dares to reread her deceased brother's diary and reflects on her childhood years in a loving home, the turbulent months of Wolf's disappearance and the even more turbulent years following his death.


In this story, she tries to find her role as a writer and as a sister. In doing so, she embarks on a journey of her own. In exploring her grief, she looks not for explanations, but glimmers of light in the darkness.

After a turbulent and harsh childhood Jo decides to join a monastery, where he becomes entangled in a dubious relationship with one of the priests. Just before he will be ordained, Jo leaves the clergy and moves to the big city. He loses himself in the vibrant club scene of the 70s and learns to embrace his sexuality. He also meets Felix and the two men share a tragicomic life for decades to come, even though the priest from Jo's past continues to haunt the couple.

With great virtuosity, Kristien De Wolf turns the 70s into a scintillating decor of a young man's search for a life on his own terms in a world filled with taboos, misconceptions, but also with love. Beautiful Jo is an impressive portrait of queerness in the seventies and an exploration of love and betrayal in all shapes and sizes.



In this autofictional debut we follow Bintu – Bintje to her Flemish grandfather – a woman who carries both Belgium and Congo within her. She grows up in the 1990s; racism is everywhere. Bintje's father was the son of a minister in his native Congo, but in his new homeland he can work only as an odd-job man at his daughter's school. Frustrated, he loses himself in God, takes to the bottle and becomes increasingly aggressive at home. The family falls apart. Bintje adores her father and keeps giving him new chances, but she doesn't succeed in becoming part of his life.


The demons of her father's roots, the scars of her childhood, and ever-present racism shape and dominate her adult life too. When Bintje becomes a mother herself and realizes that her son Finn, with his white appearance, doesn't resemble her or her father in any way, she snaps. Eventually she severs all contact with Finn and his father. Her job as a teacher provides her with something to hold onto, until she loses control at school and is forced to confront her childhood traumas.

In meticulous prose, Salumu shows what it's like to grow up as a girl and woman of colour in a white environment. She raises fascinating philosophical questions about identity, generational trauma, admiration and parenthood, and succeeds in deeply affecting the reader with this passionate debut.

Carla de Jong made her debut in 2009 with the well-received *In Retraite*, a novel based on her own experiences at a retreat. The novel sold over 25,000 copies. Her novel *Geheim Leven* was published in 2019.

When Walter Lucius passed in 2021, his family and agent asked Carla de Jong to complete *The Tide of the World*.



Walter Lucius is the pseudonym of Walter Goverde. He worked as a playwright and director for theatre and television and is the author of the internationally acclaimed *Hartland*-trilogy. The trilogy has been translated into seven languages and the first volume was awarded the Schaduwprijs.

At the time of his passing in 2021, he was writing *The Tide of the World*.

How much are you willing to sacrifice to protect your integrity?

When architect Carlo Nobile dies at the age of 90 without any children of his own, his close relatives flock to Rome to get their hands on the fortune he leaves behind. His stepson Clément Lambert is convinced he is the sole heir because he is the heir of his mother, the late actress Liliane Solaro di Moretta. 


Charlotte of Belgium, daughter of King Leopold I, is ten years old when she loses her mother and is left with an emotionally unreachable father. She longs for love and thinks she has found it in Maximilian, archduke of Austria. She soon enters into a lonely existence in a loveless and childless marriage. Along with her husband, she travels to Mexico to serve her new country as Empress Carlota. But there a revolution is brewing, and the promised support of Napoleon III and the royal houses of Europe fails to materialize. Maximilian's overseas adventure ends in front of a firing squad. Carlota never recovers from that trauma. She is pursued by delusions, suffers from paranoia and constantly thinks someone intends to kill her. She ends up back in Belgium, 'imprisoned' in a castle, guarded by doctors. From her last place of residence she tells her life story in a long letter to B., her illegitimate son, in an attempt to disentangle the great mysteries of her life.

After years of research, Dieltiens manages with consummate skill to enter into the inner life of her character. In language rich in imagery, she shows us a fascinating woman, who flounders and, despite being driven to madness, obstinately tries to keep her head above water. *Carlota, The Woman Who Ate Roses* is an engrossing historical novel that opens up remarkable worlds: that of the royal house and the nobility, that of a powerfully evocative Mexico, and that of the human spirit, which after loneliness and longing flirts with madness.

From revolutions to modern genetics, beans are inextricably connected to our history

Beans have never been sexy. Throughout history, they've always been seen as a poor person's alternative to meat. And yet beans, apart from being incredibly nutritious and good for soil, have played a fundamental role in the human story.

Their domestication during the neolithic revolution was essential to our shift from hunter-gatherers to farmers. No surprise then that lentils feature prominently in the Old Testament. Fermented soy beans powered imperial China, just as fava beans enabled a population explosion in medieval Europe. Where Mendel's experiments with peas laid the foundation for modern genetics, coffee beans turbocharged the French Revolution.

They are also connected with oppression and popular struggle: the common bean – and its many varieties (kidney, borlotti, green, white, etc.) – first made its way around the world after Colombus' discovery of the Americas, and cacao beans were a major driver of the transatlantic slave trade.


In the United States, black-eyed peas emerged as a proud symbol of Black identity, while chickpeas remain a point of contention for identity politics in the Middle East. Above all, perhaps, beans are our future: in these times of climate crisis, legumes such as lupine beans hold the key to juicy meat-alternatives and sustainable food systems.
