

Medaria "Rondo" Arradondo with Jennifer Amie CHIEF RONDO: Securing Justice for the Murder of George Floyd North American: Diversion Books


# Upon the fifth anniversary of the murder of George Floyd comes a landmark book on leadership, justice, and race by the man who led Minneapolis through and beyond the crime, the historic protest movement, and the nationwide reckoning on race and policing.

On May 25, 2020, at a neighborhood convenience store, George Floyd was killed by Minneapolis police. In the weeks that followed, the city and the entire nation erupted with the most destructive and costly civil unrest in the United States since the Los Angeles riots 28 years earlier. Standing steadfast in the middle was Medaria "Rondo" Arradondo, the first Black police chief in the 152-year history of the Minneapolis Police Department.

Growing up in Minneapolis, Rondo understood from an early age that while police could be heroes, they could also be threats, especially to Black men like himself. When he became an officer, his purpose was clear: he would serve the loving community that raised him and would always treat others with dignity and respect, no matter the color of their skin. In 2020 when Chief Rondo found himself at the helm of a troubled department facing a national crisis, he put accountability first. Instead of walking the line between Black and Blue, he drew a line between right and wrong.

CHIEF RONDO is a first-hand account of these pivotal events, offering new insights into his leadership and the broader impact on American policing. He reveals the challenges of working within a flawed system and provides inspiration for all leaders.

**Medaria "Rondo" Arradondo** was appointed as Minneapolis' first Black Chief of Police in 2017. He has gained global recognition for his role in leading Black and Blue through the George Floyd crisis, securing justice and implementing reforms while enhancing transparency. Awareness of Rondo's role in bringing justice for George Floyd led to his appearances on *60 Minutes, Real Time with Bill Maher,* CNN, Fox News, MSNBC, ABC, CBS, NBC and NPR. Rondo retired in 2022 after 32 years of service and now serves as President and CEO of Optimus Sui Consulting, LLC. His upcoming film documentary, RONDO, will expand on his leadership through the George Floyd crisis and his time as police chief.




No one gets hurt is a fine plan. A worthy goal. But when it comes down to the moment, there's always plenty of hurt to go around.




Humanity is dying. Banished from the Earth, our descendants eke out lives in orbital habitats and moon colonies-and look with longing on our former home. But Earth is uninhabitable. Over hundreds of years, its oceans transformed into an annihilating liquid entity-the Caul. Every living creature approaching its shores is irresistibly compelled to enter-and is never seen again. In facilities along its shores, scientists seek to understand and stop the Caul. And scavenging the shores are the penitents--those who resist its siren lure.

Penitent Mae Jameson-an octogenarian former Service agent who arrived on Earth thirty years ago to find her lover-encounters a child wandering alone by the shore. The mute girl, Siofra, leads Mae back to her camp, where Mae finds the girl's father Carl Magellan hanging from a noose. Mae can tell he's not committed suicide, but has been murdered. Finding Magellan's journals covering his nine years on Earth, she decides to take in Siofra and investigate the death.

Carl's journal entries detail his arrival at the research facility with his wife, a fellow mathematician, and their work studying topologies, the huge hyperdimensional shapes that are daily remade by the Caul's tides. They are obsessed with unlocking the Caul's mysteries, even as it takes a debilitating toll on them both.

Mae discovers Carl was on the verge of an important breakthrough and that he feared for his life. Learning that the child Siofra is much more than she seems--and perhaps at the center of what may be a conspiracy involving humanity's future--Mae faces threats, arson, poisoning, and attempted murder in her search for the truth.


Tim Chawaga's sci-fi mystery debut, in which a diver searching for nostalgic salvage discovers the body of the most infamous man in flooded Florida and must avoid suspicion from both feds and corporate mafias, reminiscent of Kim Stanley Robinson's New York 2140 and inspired by John D. MacDonald's Travis McGee series.

Triss Mackey is flying just under the radar, exploiting a government loophole that lets her live quietly aboard the Floating Ghost—her rented, sentient CabanaBoat. In exchange, she dives for recycling, recovered from the flooded area of formerly-coastal cities known as the yoreshore. If she happens to find some salvagia—nostalgic salvage, valued artifacts from the past—well, that's just between her and the highest bidder.

But when the federal government begins withdrawing from Florida entirely, Triss must buy the Ghost outright or lose her loophole. Meanwhile, the corporate mafias are poised to seize power, especially Mourning in Miami, led by the legendary Edgar Ortiz, owner of the Astro America luxury hotel. Triss needs a score big enough to keep her free from both the feds and corporations, before the Ghost is sent to a watery, insurance-scamming grave.

In pursuit of such a score, she stumbles upon the chained up, drowned corpse of Ortiz, and winds up with more than she bargained for, including a partnership with Ortiz's hotshot space racing son, Riley. If she can help Riley solve the mystery of his father's death, it may lead them to a valuable piece of salvagia and with it, the hope of a sustainable, free way of Florida living.

**Tim Chawaga** is a writer and playwright whose short fiction has been featured in *Interzone* and *Escape Pod* and whose work has been performed in New York and Philadelphia at many venues that have either closed or been converted into gyms. He has a BFA in Drama from the Tisch School of the Arts, is a 2019 graduate of Clarion West, and is the recipient of George R.R. Martin's Worldbuilder Scholarship. He lives in Brooklyn.



Igraine, destined mother of King Arthur, takes center stage in this powerful, feminist retelling of Camelot.

The stories of Camelot do not begin with the sword in the stone—but rather with a twisted chain of murder, magic, and deceit.

Igraine is happily married to Gorlois, Duke of Cornwall, even though his withdrawal from the Mysteries has created a strain between them, as well as friction between her and Vivian, High Priestess of the Goddess and the Lady of the Lake. While they are visiting King Uther Pendragon at his castle, Uther makes it obvious to the entire court that he desires Igraine to be his queen. Later, he accosts her in the castle corridors, and when Igraine informs her husband of what happened, Gorlois gathers his people and abruptly leaves the festivities, declaring war. England has only recently found peace, and Merlin pleads with Gorlois to pledge allegiance to Uther. But Gorlois' pride will keep him bent toward war, no matter the cost to his people.

Bravely assuming the role of leader at Tintagel Castle, Igraine encourages the women left behind to continue working the fields to show their devotion to the Goddess and instructing her two daughters Morgause and Morgan to harness their own powers. She plans a grand summer solstice celebration, inviting their allies. On the eve of the solstice, Gorlois unexpectedly returns to Tintagel. But it is only after she lies with who she thinks is her beloved husband that Igraine learns the full extent of Merlin and Vivian's devious plot.

Igraine is chosen by the Goddess, by the Lady of the Lake, by Merlin, by Uther Pendragon . . . but in the end, she will choose her own fate.

The French Colonies are filled with explorers, merchants and most of all, criminals. 





Mir Mahmoud Bahmanyar earned a BA in History from UC Berkeley, enlisted in the Second Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment, and obtained an MA in War Studies from King's College London. He has been a military technical advisor on such films as *The Good German, Black Hawk Down*, and *We Were Soldiers*; a German language coach; and a producer and writer in Hollywood. He co-wrote and produced the award-winning independent historical film *Soldier of God* and has authored numerous books and articles from ancient history to modern war, which have been translated into Arabic, German, Japanese, Polish, and Spanish. Holding dual US and Canadian citizenship, he lives in Toronto.



Working first from a cubicle in the *Rolling Stone* headquarters in New York and at the constant beck and call of the legendary Jann Wenner, Craig began his work, hounding musicians and their managers for memorabilia for the non-existent museum. His travels brought him to the doorsteps of the most legendary musicians of our time; to Ozzy Osburn's vast English estate (Ozzie met him with a rifle in hand), to Keith Moon's perfectly preserved boyhood bedroom. He pored through letters Paul Simon wrote to Art Garfunkel when they were both kids at sleep away camps, and from Yoko Yono he collected John Lennon's, stored with his other possessions in a heavy steel briefcase on the day of his murder. Every story is told in lush detail Rock and Roll fans will savor.

Equally fascinating is Inciardi's first-hand account of the chaotic formation of the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame itself, taking us backstage to the very first induction ceremonies, an innocent time when long overlooked musicians and some former enemies celebrated each other and jammed into the night with friends and family looking on, as well as the secret induction meetings where top record company executives and managers bitterly argued over who would be included and who wouldn't.



It was native to only one wind-battered ridgeline high on the continental divide in Monteverde, Costa Rica's cloud forests. For a few weeks each year, thousands of golden toads would congregate in ephemeral pools among the twisted roots of the elfin forest to mate, deposit their offspring, and vanish again beneath the earth. There has not been a confirmed sighting of a golden toad in more than 30 years.

While many books for singles focus on methods for finding a partner or preach a begrudging acceptance of singledom, *SOLO* celebrates all that a single life can be: joyful, social, fulfilling, and rewarding. McGraw's advice focuses on how readers can lead thriving lives outside of romantic relationships through the pursuit of purpose and connection. And while a strong foundation is vital for those choosing to live alone, the building blocks to a gratifying life are equally integral to those in relationships who might find themselves disconnected from life at large. Because, ultimately, all of us are responsible for building meaningful, fulfilling lives for ourselves.

Peter McGraw is an expert in the interdisciplinary fields of judgment, emotion, and choice. His work has appeared in *Management Science, Psychological Science, Journal of Consumer Research, Journal of Marketing Research, Journal of Personality and Social Psychology*, and *Organizational Behavior and Human Decision Processes.* McGraw received a BA in psychology and MEd in educational psychology from Rutgers University and an MS and PhD in quantitative psychology from the Ohio State University.
