Most of us are familiar with the three Fs of trauma—flight, fight, or freeze. But new research has identified a fourth, extremely common (yet little-understood) response, fawning. Often mislabeled as "codependency" or "people pleasing," fawning occurs when we paradoxically draw closer to a person or relationship that causes pain rather than pulling away. Fawning explains why we stay in unhealthy partnerships and dysfunctional environments, even when it seems obvious to others that we should go. It's a protective response to an unsafe situation. But when fawning turns from an emergency coping mechanism into an everyday habit, it stops being useful and starts being a problem. The good news: we can break the fawning pattern for good, once we see it for the trauma response it is. Drawing on fifteen years of clinical psychology work—as well as a lifetime of experience as a recovering fawner herself—Dr. Ingrid Clayton has written the first commercial book on this emerging topic. Readers will learn why we fawn, how to recognize the signs of fawning, and what we can do to successfully "unfawn." FAWNING will give trauma survivors the vocabulary to discuss their experiences and, in so doing, give them the tools to finally heal.
