

With the dark comedy and sharp observations of Monica Heisey and Dolly Alderton, a whip-smart and laugh-out-loud funny debut novel about a disgraced, newly divorced journalist demoted to a "clickbait" job at a Manhattan tabloid

The first thing they tell you when you begin your training is never to become the news.

Natasha has screwed up royally. Her mistake isn't just embarrassing, it's a breach of journalistic ethics that makes headlines and costs her a plum job reporting from London. Back in New York at thirty-five and single, divorced from a kind man she loved, she finds herself at the bottom of the media food chain—a junior reporter at a clickbait factory, rewriting sensational tabloid stories to make them just different enough to avoid lawsuits.



As if her professional fall from grace weren't bad enough, she's taken the money she'd saved for a down payment for a home on a charming Brooklyn block with her husband, and rashly bought a boxy apartment overlooking the gray ocean in Rockaway Beach, Queens.

Though seeing friends and family only serves to remind her of what she's lost, things begin to pick up when her ex-boyfriend Zach moves back to New York and accepts her offer of a spare bedroom. The arrangement is strictly platonic, of course—for him. But Natasha can't help but wonder whether he might be the solution to all her problems.

As Natasha's obsession with Zach grows and her involvement in increasingly dystopian "churnalism" deepens, her worlds threaten to collide in the most cataclysmic, extremely public way.

Holly Baxter is a journalist and writer from Newcastle, who spent 12 years working in London journalism before transferring to New York City in 2019. Having reported for *The Guardian* and *The New Statesman*, she now does



political satire and social justice-themed investigations for *The Independent*. Her work was shortlisted for a Press Award for Feature of the Year in 2019 and she often appears on British radio and television.In 2013, she coauthored THE VAGENDA, a media satire non-fiction book for women, with *The Guardian*'s Rhiannon Lucy Cosslett. She is currently based in Brooklyn, where she lives with her husband, son and semi-feral cat Nelson, and is covering the 2024 US election for *The Independent*. @h0llyb4xter

P. T. Deutermann is a contemporary master of World War II military fiction: writing about the lives, deaths, dreams, fears, and combat

experiences of sailors and soldiers, generals and grunts, captains and snipes, pilots and submariners, who served in the Pacific theatre war against Japan.

March 1945: After a career of commanding destroyers in the Pacific theater of WWII, Captain Wolfe Bowen is based in Washington, DC, working for the Chief of Naval Operations. Bowen receives an urgent call from the commander of the naval shipyard in Portsmouth, New Hampshire: A German U-boat has been captured and brought to port. But what grabs Bowen's attention is the presence of two Japanese civilians on board, along with the massive size of the U-boat itself. What these civilians know about the cargo of the U-boat, as well as its destination, begins a race against time that will change the course of history.

When President Franklin Delano Roosevelt dies, Harry Truman ascends to office with no prior knowledge of the Manhattan Project. Working with a small team—including Captain Villem Amherst Van Rensselaer, part of the inner circle on the Manhattan Project, and Lieutenant Commander Janet Waring, a naval intelligence officer and skilled translator of Japanese—Bowen must report back to President Truman with the information that will transform the war—and the world.

Combining the toxic obsession of SINGLE WHITE FEMALE with the dark side of celebrity explored in VOX LUX and THE LOVE SONG OF JOHNNY VALENTINE, AMERICAN SPIRITS probes how all artists steal, emulating their heroes to the point of transformation, or in some cases, takeover.

It's 2019 and 37-year-old Blue Velour has finally achieved the critical acclaim she's long been chasing (think: Lana Del Rey after Norman Fucking

Rockwell). Her latest album, *Blue's Beard*—a cheeky reference to the subreddit fanatically dedicated to her suspected secret relationship with her longtime producer—has rocket-launched her reputation. Given the pressures of the upcoming tour, she hires a new assistant, Rose Lutz, a nerdy superfan with a classically trained voice who is, unknown to Blue, also the founder of r/BlueBeards.


When the pandemic shuts down the *Blue's Beard* tour, Blue retreats to a cabin in the redwoods with her producer and assistant to make another album. Rose is delighted to be isolated with the two objects of her longtime obsession, and there a strange love triangle develops. During a manic episode, Blue goes behind Sasha's back to release the album, which is panned by critics. Furious at the failure, Blue fires Sasha and Rose, relapses, and drives to New York to work with Sasha's nemesis. While Blue is hitting rock bottom, Rose convinces Sasha to stay in the redwoods and make their own album. By the time the cabin lease is up, Blue's sister is checking her into rehab.

Back in LA, Sasha struggles to get Rose signed until a viral Britney Spears cover propels Rose into the spotlight, enabling them to sell their record, *Pop My Cherry*. Blue is livid to learn about it and, adding insult to injury, Blue's album *Violet* comes out to little fanfare. With urging from her sister, Blue gives her fans the chaos they crave by teaming up with Rose and Sasha to make a new album. The three of them make what becomes *American Spirits* under the name Blue Rose during three darkly debaucherous months in Malibu. But at the *American Spirits*

tour, both Blue and Rose try to outstunt each other to avenge various past wrongs, culminating in a tragic act that changes their lives forever.

A controversial LA author attempts to revive her career and finally find true love in this hilarious nod to 1950s lesbian pulp fiction.

Mid-list author Astrid Dahl, recently moved into a tiny bungalow in Los Angeles, finds herself back in the Zoom writer's group she cofounded after an incident that leaves her and her career *lightly* canceled. But she temporarily forgets that by throwing herself into a few sexy distractions—like Ivy, a grad student researching 1950s lesbian pulp who smells like metallic orchids, or her new neighbor, Penelope, a painter who smells like patchouli. Penelope immediately ingratiates herself in Astrid's life, bonding with her best friends and family, just as Astrid and Ivy begin to date in person. Astrid feels judged and threatened by Penelope, but also finds her irresistibly sexy.

When Astrid receives an unexpected call from her agent with news that she finally has a chance to resurrect her waning career, the pressure causes Astrid's worst vice to rear its head—the Patricia Highsmith, a blend of Adderall, alcohol, and cigarettes—and results in blackouts and a disturbing series of events.



Twenty-five-year-old Penelope Lin spends her days cataloging an archeology museum's vast collection of Qing Dynasty-era bound feet shoes, wandering the streets of Philadelphia appreciating its architecture, and reading up on her beloved hero, Napoleon. After suffering her first big heartbreak several years ago, she's built a quiet life with a few close friends and no romantic entanglements. While running a work errand one day, she happens to meet Hoang, who has just confessed to releasing the lab mice in the cancer research lab he works at. He will almost certainly be fired, but he hates to lie. Hoang's openness catches Penelope off guard and from then on, she finds her carefully constructed life slowly start to unravel.

Terrified of "leaping into the same sea from which [she'd] already once escaped," Penelope pursues Hoang in ways that breach her comfort zone but remain bewilderingly oblique to her no-nonsense friends and, of course, to Hoang himself. Her days become consumed with volunteering with a labor union for an excuse to run into him, though she has never even voted, and agonizing over letters and postcards that skirt her true feelings. When she receives an unexpected visit from her ex-boyfriend and learns a jarring revelation regarding the whereabouts of her estranged mother, Penelope is forced to confront her past in order to take a leap of faith.

GINGKO SEASON is a wise and tender-hearted debut novel that explores the nature of our deepest friendships as seriously as it does the dizzying terror and thrill of falling in love. With Raven Leilani's flaneur-like prose, GINGKO SEASON channels the wry humor and quiet devastation of Rachel Khong's GOODBYE, VITAMIN. 





At an otherwise forgettable party in Los Angeles, a queer Korean American painter spots a woman who instantly controls the room: gorgeous and distant and utterly white, the center of everyone's attention. Haunted into adulthood by her Korean father's abandonment of his family, as well as the specter of her beguiling, abusive white mother, the painter finds herself caught in a perfect trap. She wants Hanne, or wants to be her, or to sully her, or destroy her, or consume her, or some confusion of all the above. Since she's an artist, she will use art to get closer to Hanne, beginning a series of paintings with her new muse as model. As for Hanne, what does she want? Her whiteness seems sometimes as cruel as a new sheet of paper.

When the paintings of Hanne become a hit, resulting in the artist's first sold-out show, she resolves to bring her new muse with her to Berlin, to continue their work, and her seduction. But, just when the painter is on the verge of her long sought-after breakthrough, a petition started by a Black performance artist begins making the rounds in the art community, calling for the boycott of major museums and art galleries for their imperialist and racist practices.

Torn between her desire to support the petition, to be a success, and to possess Hanne, the painter and her reality become more unstable and disorienting, unwilling to cut loose any one of her warring ambitions, yet unable to accommodate them all. Is it any wonder so many artists self-destruct so spectacularly? Is it perhaps just a bit exciting to think she could too?

Your Love Is Not Good stuffs queer explosive into the cracks between identity and aspiration, between desire and art, and revels in the raining debris.

Johanna Hedva (they/them) is a Korean-American writer, artist, and musician, who was raised in Los Angeles by a family of witches, and now lives in LA and Berlin. Their novel, *On Hell*, was named one of Dennis Cooper's favorites of 2018, and their writing has been published in *Triple Canopy, frieze*, and *The White Review*. Their art work has been shown at the Institute of Contemporary Arts, London; Performance Space New York; the Museum of Architecture and Design, Los Angeles; and the Museum of Contemporary Art on the Moon. In 2019, they released the album, The Sun and the Moon, and in 2020 they released *Minerva the Miscarriage of the Brain*, a collection of poetry, plays, and essays published by Sming Sming and Wolfman Books. Johanna is the author of the viral/seminal essay in disability justice, "Sick Woman Theory" (forthcoming in their essay collection, HOW TO TELL WHEN WE WILL DIE, from Zando in 2024—Zando has World rights). This dazzling, magical realist historical follows three generations of a northern Chinese family, beginning in present-day NYC with an estranged father's sudden reappearance in his daughter's life.

Qianze, a Chinese American woman from the South, has not heard from Ba since he walked out on her and her mother eleven years ago. The man who shows up on her doorstep is deeply changed, struggling with dementia and alcoholism, but he has found his way back to her to deliver

a warning prophecy-only he's forgotten it. As Qianze resentfully takes Ba in, attempting to unspool the mystery of his decade-long absence, Ba tumbles into harrowing childhood memories of his time in the Red Guard during the Cultural Revolution, when he was a young boy named Weihong.

The story zooms backward in time to Ba's childhood and that of his mother, Qianze's grandmother. Ming, who grew up in rural Manchuria during the Second Sino-Japanese War and Japanese occupation, is kidnapped and made to be a comfort woman for the Japanese Kwantung Army. There, she encounters an inhuman creature who irrevocably alters Ming's family's fate, with reverberations that Qianze and Ba can confront only by reconciling with each other.

A BEAST SLINKS TOWARDS BEIJING derives its title from William B. Yeats' poem, "The Second Coming," a reference to the Anti-Christ. But in this story, there is no Anti-Christ; humanity, destiny, morality, and horror refract into a spectrum, and no one is innocent of history's atrocities. Yang's spell-binding novel explores intergenerational trauma and the legacy of colonialism, with an unforgettable father-daughter relationship at its heart. Told in an interwoven narrative, the book combines the generational scope of Rachel Khong's forthcoming Real Americans and the family dynamics of Charles Yu's How to Live Safely in a Science Fictional Universe, with a dash of K-Ming Chang's fabulism.

Alice Evelyn Yang is a Chinese American writer from Norfolk, Virginia. Her work has been published in MQR, AAWW's The Margins, and The Rumpus, among others. Her work has been sponsored by Tin House Workshops, and she is the recipient of the 2022-23 Jesmyn Ward Prize from MOR. 
In this original lullaby, rich cultural traditions combine with a family's hopes for their baby to create a soothing ritual sure to be a favorite bedtime read and baby shower gift.



In this beautifully illustrated, Chinese-themed take on how a spoonful of sugar makes the medicine go down, we follow a spunky Mimi as she does everything within her power to not to

drink Waipo's liangcha, only to realize that she is rejecting Waipo's caring love by doing so. By the end, Waipo and Mimi meet in the middle and delight in a sweet antidote to the bitterness.
