



His work includes critical writings on the Vietnam War, Hiroshima, nuclear weapons, the Cold War, the Arab-Israeli conflict, and the CIA. 



Ross W. Greene, PhD, is the originator of the innovative, evidence-based approach called *Collaborative & Proactive Solutions* (CPS). Dr. Greene was on the faculty at Harvard Medical School for over twenty years and is now founding director of the nonprofit Lives in the Balance. He is also currently adjunct Professor in the Department of Psychology at Virginia Tech. Dr. Greene has worked with several thousand kids with concerning behaviors and their caregivers, and he and his colleagues have overseen implementation and evaluation of the CPS model in countless schools, inpatient psychiatry units, and residential and juvenile detention facilities, with dramatic effect: significant reductions in recidivism, discipline referrals, detentions, suspensions, and use of restraint and seclusion.





For the doomed stand American forces made in the Philippines at the start of World War II, two generals received their country's highest military award, the Medal of Honor. One was the charismatic and controversial Douglas MacArthur, whose orders forced him to leave his soldiers on the islands to starvation and surrender but whose vow to return echoed around the globe. The other was the gritty Jonathan Mayhew Wainwright, who became a hero to the troops whose fate he insisted on sharing even when it meant becoming the highest-ranking American prisoner of the Japanese. In *The Fate of the Generals*, bestselling author Jonathan Horn brings together the story of two men who won the same medal but found honor on very different paths. MacArthur's journey would require a daring escape with his wife and young child to Australia and then years of fighting over the thousands of miles needed to make it back to the Philippines, where he would fulfill his famous vow only to see the city he called home burn.

Jonathan Horn is the author of *Washington's End* and the Robert E. Lee biography *The Man Who Would Not Be Washington*, which was a *Washington Post* bestseller. Earlier in his career, he served at the White House as a presidential speechwriter. He has written for outlets including *The Wall Street Journal, The Washington Post, The New York Times* Disunion series, *New York Post, The Daily Beast, National Review*, and *POLITICO*, and has appeared on CBS *Sunday Morning*, CNN, Fox News, MSNBC, and PBS *NewsHour*. A graduate of Yale, he lives in Bethesda, Maryland, with his wife, two children, and dog.



Rowan Jacobsen has been reporting, researching, and writing about the quiet revolution that has transformed our understanding of sunlight's effect on human health since his year as a Knight Science Journalism Fellow at MIT in 2019. He next worked with Richard Weller, MD, Chair of Dermatology at the University of Edinburgh (who will write the Foreword to this book). Weller, along with other prominent dermatologists, especially Australians, has long taken exception to the no-sun dictum preached by the majority of dermatologists (for good reason: they want to save patients from skin cancer.) However, we now have solid evidence that modest sun exposure to the skin and the resulting biological manufacture of vitamin D can reduce blood pressure, regulate the immune system, improve sleep, prevent myopia, and trigger the flow of mood-lifting endorphins. Recent studies suggest its ability to protect against heart disease, stroke, diabetes, depression, dementia, respiratory infections, and autoimmune diseases such as MS, a disease that plagues (mostly) women of high latitudes (See Chapter 8: The Golden Molecule and the Remarkable Sun-Sensitivity of Multiple Sclerosis).

Rowan Jacobsen is also the author of the James Beard Award-winning *A Geography of Oysters* and *Truffle Hound*, named a Best Nonfiction Book of the Year by *Publisher's Weekly*. He has been featured on *All Things Considered*, *The Splendid Table*, *CBS This Morning*, *Weekend Edition*, and *Morning Edition*; has performed with Pop-Up Magazine; has lectured at Harvard and Yale; and has written and hosted a variety of podcasts. He lives in Vermont, an extremely challenging state when it comes to sunshine.


Since 2012, *Jeopardy!* champion and host Ken Jennings has created a weekly puzzle—first for *Parade*, then for *Mental Floss*—involving a series of trivia questions whose answers have something in common. The trivia questions cover a full gamut of topics, from pop culture (movies, TV, music) to more academic knowledge (history, geography, the arts) to lifestyle (food and drink, sports, consumer pursuits). The final connection can be even more varied. Many of the quizzes stick to canonical trivia categories (D-Day beaches! Presidential middle names! Santa's reindeer! Batman villains!) but almost anything goes. What do feet, McDonald's, fingerprints, and St. Louis have in common? They all have arches. What about Mercury, Chihuahuas, electrons, and Rhode Island? They're all the smallest of their kind. Columbia, Grease, and "I Ran" (by A Flock of Seagulls)? They're all homophones for country names.

While the vast majority of the Kennections canon had been lost to time in the bowels of the internet, it's now available in one convenient volume—*The Complete Kennections*, the perfect gift for any *Jeopardy!* fan, trivia buff, or *New York Times*' "Connections" puzzler.

Ken Jennings is the *New York Times* bestselling author of *Brainiac*, *Maphead*, *Because I Said So!*, and *Planet Funny*. In 2020, he won the "Greatest of All Time" title on the quiz show *Jeopardy!* and in 2022, he succeeded Alex Trebek as a host of the show. He is living in Seattle during his mortal sojourn, but his posthumous whereabouts are still to be determined.







Robert Crumb is often credited with single-handedly transforming the comics medium into a place for adult expression, in the process pioneering the underground comic book industry, and transforming the vernacular language of 20th-century America into an instantly recognizable and popular aesthetic, as iconic as Walt Disney or Charles Schulz. Now, for the first time, Dan Nadel, a curator and writer specializing in comics and art, shares how this complicated artist survived childhood abuse, fame in his twenties, more fame, and came out the other side intact. More than just a biography of an iconic cartoonist, *Crumb* is the story of a richly complex life at the forefront of both the underground and popular cultures of post-war America.

Dan Nadel is a writer and curator. His previous books include, *It's Life as a I See It: Black Cartoonists in Chicago, 1940–1980*; *Peter Saul: Professional Artist Correspondence, 1945–1976*; and *Art Out of Time: Unknown Comic Visionaries, 1900–1969*. Nadel has curated exhibitions for galleries and museums internationally including the Museum of Contemporary Art Chicago, the Manetti Shrem Museum of Art, UC Davis, and the Whitney Museum of American Art. He is the founder of PictureBox, a publishing and packaging company that produced over one hundred books, objects, and zines from 2000 to 2014, including the Grammy Award–winning design for Wilco's 2004 album *A Ghost Is Born*. Dan is the curator-at-large for the Lucas Museum of Narrative Art. He lives in Brooklyn, New York, with his family.



Winner of the prestigious Sor Juana de la Cruz prize for literature. After her powerful debut, Variations on the Body, María Ospina returns with a gently adventurous novel about migration told from the perspective of creatures hiding in plain sight: animals. A migratory tanager struggles with the detours imposed by the lights of the city and its buildings, an orphaned porcupine is fed with human milk, two dogs take refuge together after a rattling abandonment, and a beetle just out of the ground goes astray. These beings fly, cuddle, crawl, growl, lick, sniff, sniff, climb and search for a home, mirroring our own yearnings and aspirations along the way. Ospina reveals flashes of life through the animals who witness our suffering as well as their own, and from whose innocence and generosity we can stand to learn.

Maria Ospina left Colombia when she was 18 to attend Brown University, where she studied history and cultural studies. She has written extensively on memory, violence and nature in contemporary Colombian culture, including the book *El rompecabezas de la memoria: Literatura, cine y testimonio de comienzos de siglo en Colombia* (2019). *Variations on The Body* (Tin House, 2018) is her first short stories collection and *Just a Little Here* is her first novel.

Heather Cleary is based in New York and Mexico City. Her writing has appeared in *Two Lines*, *LitHub*, and *Words Without Borders*, among other publications. She is the author of *The Translator's Visibility: Scenes from Contemporary Latin American Fiction*, about the power of translation to challenge norms of intellectual property and propriety.







Lyrical and visceral, meditative and volcanic, *The Intentions of Thunder* stunningly explores the fullness of living and gives voice and witness to the tenderness of Black life. In a stunning blend of form, Smith confronts gender, race, and being with the potent complexity of an essential poetic voice. Fearless, shimmering, and inimitable, the poetry of Patricia Smith radiates in *The Intentions of Thunder*—affirming Smith's place as one of the most indispensable poets of our time.

Patricia Smith is a 2022 inductee of the American Academy of Arts & Sciences and the 2021 recipient of the Ruth Lilly Poetry Prize for Lifetime Achievement. She is the author of nine acclaimed books of poetry, including *Unshuttered* (2023); *Incendiary Art*, finalist for the 2018 Pulitzer Prize and winner of the 2018 Kingsley Tufts Poetry Award, the 2017 Los Angeles Times Book Prize and the 2018 NAACP Image Award, *Shoulda Been Jimi Savannah*, winner of the Lenore Marshall Prize from the Academy of American Poets; and *Blood Dazzler*, a National Book Award finalist.



Drawing on interviews with dozens of opera insiders—as well as her own experience as an award-winning vocalist, librettist, opera company director, and arts commentator—Vincent examines opera's overlapping and escalating pressure points, takes the reader on an irreverent trek through the intricacies of musical scores, staging, casting, rehearsal rooms, companies, and careers, and journeys into the very culture of the industry itself.

The result is a can't-put-it down backstage pass to a world of awesome voices, titanic egos, and creative tug of wars that, against all odds, makes us thirst to know more about an artform that too often is overlooked and under-appreciated.

Caitlin Vincent is an award-winning vocalist, librettist, opera company director, and arts commentator. Her librettos have won all three of America's top opera prizes: the Sackler Music Composition Prize (with composer Douglas Buchanan), the Domenic J. Pellicciotti Opera Composition Prize (with composer Timothy C. Takach), and the 2024/25 Dominick Argento Chamber Opera Competition (with composer Douglas Buchanan). 

Most scholars and analysts believe that the primary cause of our abysmal war record since Vietnam has been the US military's overwhelmingly conventional approach—which favors kinetic operations, highly mobile precision firepower, and sophisticated systems of command and control. Here, Warren argues that the more formidable obstacle to success has been pervasive strategic ineptitude at the highest levels of Washington, including the executive branch, congress, and the national security council responsible for shaping US foreign policy. Presidents of both political parties, including Kennedy, Reagan, Bush, Clinton, and Obama have overestimated the capacity of US forces to alter the social and political landscape of foreign nations, and underestimated the ability of insurgents and terrorists to develop strategies that draw out conflict and wage effective propaganda campaigns to curtail Washington's will to carry on the fight. Warren concludes the book by advocating for a less hubristic foreign policy and a broader conception of warfare as a political and military enterprise.

James A. Warren is a historian and foreign policy analyst. A regular contributor to *The Daily Beast*, he is the author of *God, War, and Providence: The Epic Struggle of Roger Williams and the Narragansett Indians against the Puritans of New England; American Spartans: The US Marines: A Combat History from Iwo Jima to Iraq; and The Lions of Iwo Jima: The Story of Combat Team 28 and the Bloodiest Battle in Marine Corps History* (with Major General Fred Haynes, USMC-RET), among other books.

ERNEST HEMINGWAY CATALOG

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Ernest Hemingway did more to change the style of English prose than any other writer of his time. Publication of The Sun Also Rises and A Farewell to Arms immediately established Hemingway as one of the greatest literary lights of the twentieth century. His classic novel The Old Man and the Sea won the Pulitzer Prize in 1953. Hemingway was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1954. His life and accomplishments are explored in-depth in the PBS documentary film from Ken Burns and Lynn Novick, Hemingway. Known for his largerthan-life personality and his passions for bullfighting, fishing, and big-game hunting, he died in Ketchum, Idaho on July 2, 1961.

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
