







After the seizure of power, a new everyday life has returned to Ginsterburg. Some inhabitants of the small German town suffer, others benefit - and most try to come to terms with the new order. Gradually, however, the abyss opens up beneath everyday life. A sensitive and atmospheric novel about love, family, friendship - and personal entanglements in the years 1935 to 1945.

Lothar dreams of flying. Just a young boy, his mother Merle can only watch helplessly as his dream of freedom drives her son into the arms of the Hitler Youth. A new era has dawned. As much as Merle distrusts it, she cannot escape it - not in her bookshop, not in her conversations with Eugen, the feature writer for the local newspaper in Ginsterburg. But while some fall silent and some slowly allow themselves to be corrupted, others know how to use the new distribution of power in their favour. Florist Gürckel rises to the position of district leader, factory owner Jungheinrich does excellent business, and doctor Hansemann also senses completely new opportunities. Heinz Rühmann continues to play in the cinema and the Silver Arrows race round and round the Nürburgring. But the war, fought on distant fronts, can soon be felt in the microcosm of the town, in the shattered relationships and souls of the people. And hovering over everything is a British bomber pilot who is inexorably approaching the once tranquil town of Ginsterburg.



Three female scientists, three generations, one family. The grandmother fled from Poland to Lebanon during the Second World War. The mother left Lebanon for a life in Germany. The daughter has to return to Poland for a future. A touching novel about the legacy of our mothers that we all carry with us.

The grandmother is one of the first ever female chemists. The mother is a distinguished doctor. The daughter is a computer science student. Science is the one thing they all have in common. But the bond between the generations is broken: Lucy has not spoken to her mother for years. Until suddenly a piano is delivered to her apartment. It is the Steinway on which Lucy learned to play as a child. She hates this piano. It reminds her of everything she had wanted to leave behind: the gilded cage of her overly sheltered childhood, the high expectations of her mother, and the lack of closeness between them. When her grandmother's Polish maiden name surfaces along with the piano, Lucy spontaneously catches the next train to Sopot, the only link she has to her grandmother. She needs to tie up the loose threads of her family in order to take control of her own future.




A Philosophical Terrorist Organization in Search of the Absolute Truth

The activist group *Aletheia* is on a mission to uncover the one fundamental truth. In an era dominated by fake news and alternative facts, they believe the greatest threat to society is deception. Through artistic interventions, they seek to open people's eyes. But why do they have an explosives expert among them if they never use explosives? Raphaela Edelbauer's new novel explores the nature of truth, the fragility of perception, and the radical consequences of belief.

When Byproxy is released from a supervised living facility for young adults, she spends her nights in open market stalls and her days in Vienna's coffeehouses. There, she becomes intrigued by a group of four who engage in fierce philosophical debates: they are Aletheia. Through a test of courage, she convinces them to take her into the occupied house that serves as their headquarters and commune. During grueling probation months cleaning toilets by day and studying philosophy by night—she earns their trust. But as Aletheia prepares for a major action, doubts about Byproxy begin to grow. Why does she secretly visit the mother of a girl who died in an accident every week? If anyone in Aletheia is failing to live up to their ideals of truth, it might just be *Byproxy*. Or perhaps, it's the narrator herself.



Juno spends her days helping her seriously ill husband Jupiter cope with daily life. She is also an artist, and dances and acts. And she spends her nights, on the frequent occasions when she can't sleep, chatting to love scammers on the internet. Martina Hefter has written a moving novel about needs and desires. And about how far we are prepared to go for love.

Juno chats online with men who proclaim their love to women on the internet and try to scam them out of their money. But instead of falling for their scams, Juno finds a kind of freedom in talking to these men. Born in the GDR, Stine grows up in reunified Germany. She is just three years old when the Wall comes down. The invasion of Denmark by Prussian and Austrian troops on 1 February 1864 marked the beginning of the German-Danish War, which was later to be called the first »War of Unification«. Taking into account the Schleswig-Holstein uprising of 1848/50 and the Danish view that the further development of a modern constitution in Denmark only seemed possible with the inclusion of Schleswig, Bremm describes the diplomatic backstory and the course of the war of 1864. He allows us to experience the battle first hand and describes how many elements of modern warfare played a significant role for the first time.

Klaus-Jürgen Bremm, born in 1958, is a historian and journalist. He was an officer in the German army from 1980 to 1989. He received his doctorate from the University of Potsdam in 2003 with a thesis on the military use of the railways. 
