Jens Bisky

THE DECISION – Germany 1929 to 1934

Jens Bisky, born in Leipzig in 1966, studied cultural sciences and German language and literature in Berlin. He wrote for the *Berliner Zeitung* and has been a staff writer for *Süddeutsche Zeitung*'s Feuilleton arts and culture section since 2001. He has also authored several well-received books, including *Geboren am 13. August* (2004), *Unser König: Friedrich der Große und seine Zeit* (2011), and *Berlin. Biographie einer großen Stadt* (2019). In 2017 he was awarded the Johann Heinrich Merck Prize by the German Academy for Language and Poetry for his literary criticism and essays.

In October 1929, the death of successful foreign minister Gustav Stresemann raised questions about the future of the republic. A fascist coalition was forming and took power in 1933. Farmers threw bombs, public finances faced growing deficits, and the parliamentary system seemed paralyzed. By summer 1930, the choice was between a democratic republic or a fascist state. What followed was the rise of radical forces, the disintegration of bourgeois circles, middle-class unrest, the arrogance of conservatives and nationalists who thought they could control Hitler, and fear of civil war. This led to the most criminal dictatorship of the 20th century.

Jens Bisky tells the story of how the Weimar Republic was destroyed in a whirlwind of hardship and anger, using the perspectives of the time's politicians, journalists, writers, lawyers, and officers. How did they view the situation, and what options did they have? This is a sweeping look at an extreme time that still affects the present.

We are losing the ground beneath our feet. The foundation of our existence and our economy is being sealed, over-fertilized, flooded, or dried out. Asal Dardan, born in 1978 in Tehran, grew up in Cologne, Bonn, and Aberdeen. She studied Cultural Studies in Hildesheim and Middle Eastern Studies in Lund, and now lives in Berlin. Her essays have won and have been nominated for several prizes, such as the German Non-Fiction Prize.

Unable to wipe away the blood or erase the fact that it was shed. Making the deed and the guilt visible, even if the perpetrators never lifted a hand and the victims remained invisible: "Blood is on your hands." This is how Asal Dardan justifies the necessity of remembering and the responsibility of future generations. In *Traumaland*, she creates a new topography of Germany, traces the past, and explores parallel and contrasting experiences in immigrant society. The painful past reaches into our present, with Nazi crimes echoing cruelly in today's racist violence and the traumatic experiences of minorities.

Who shapes German history? Who bears responsibility for past guilt? Which memories are told, and which remain unheard? Asal Dardan challenges entrenched memory discourses with her quest for connections, simultaneous experiences, and hope for a shared remembrance that accommodates different realities.

Fabio De Masi, born in 1980, is a German-Italian politician (*BSW*). He served in the European Parliament and the German Bundestag. He studied economics in Hamburg, obtained a master's degree in International Relations from the *University of Cape Town*, and another master's degree in International Economics from the *Berlin School of Economics and Law*. He gained national attention as the Left's representative on the Parliamentary Inquiry Committee on the *Wirecard* case.

Whether it is the financial crisis, the Wirecard scandal, or the Cum-Ex deals of Warburg Bank, politicians have paved the way for criminals in suits. How can this be? Few understand the reasons and background better than Fabio De Masi, known as the "financial detective". He was the first politician to warn about Wirecard when the government was still talking about a German stock market and internet miracle. He also tangled Chancellor Olaf Scholz in contradictions over his claimed memory lapses in the Warburg affair.

In this book, Fabio De Masi uncovers the systemic causes of financial crises, the forces behind recent financial scandals, and the battle for control of the financial and data highways on the internet. He also gives a behind-the-scenes look at parliament and his own motivations. Finally, he explains what needs to be done now to protect our democracy.

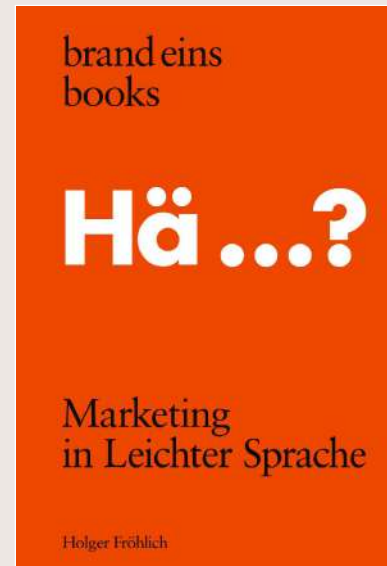

Dennis Gastmann, born in 1978, traveled the world for years as a foreign correspondent. His highly praised book *Mit 80.000 Fragen um die Welt* was published in 2011, followed by his journey from Germany over the Alps to Italy to atone for his sins (*Gang nach Canossa*, 2012). For *Atlas der unentdeckten Länder* (2016), he visited the last unexplored locations on Earth, and he explored Japan for *Der vorletzte Samurai* (2018). His travel reports have all become *Spiegel* bestsellers. His latest work is *Dalee*, his first novel. Dennis Gastmann lives in Hamburg and works around the world.

The world is vast, round, and brilliantly blue – and Dennis Gastmann has experienced it all. Sometimes in glimpses, sometimes in full technicolor, and sometimes like a fever dream, from Andalusia to Allahabad, Sydney to Swakopmund, and the thousand lights of Manhattan to Madurai, the Tamil city of temples and sorcerers. In this book, the seasoned reporter shares his adventures around the world.

He travels with a gold prospector through the Australian desert, dances with Finland's most famous tango instructor, and philosophizes on Taiwan with a Chinese dissident about the price of freedom. In India, he kneels before the leader of the Hijra, the third gender, and in California, he rolls through a "drive-in funeral". 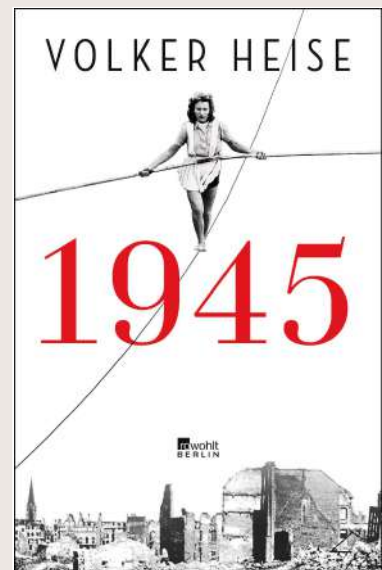

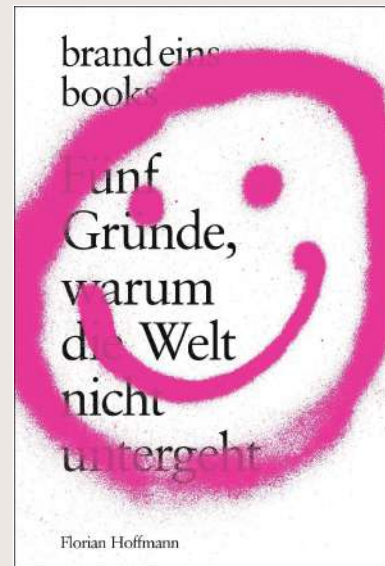

Annette Kehnel studied history and biology at Albert-Ludwigs-Universität Freiburg, Somerville College Oxford, and LMU Munich. Her doctoral studies at Trinity College Dublin focused on the research of Irish monastic communities, after which she habilitated at the University of Dresden. Since 2005, she has held the Chair of Medieval History at the University of Mannheim. Her book *Wir konnten auch anders* (2021), in which Kehnel explores medieval sustainability knowledge for the present, became a *Spiegel* bestseller and won the NDR Non-Fiction Book Prize.

We live in an era of crisis, yet we have little idea how to escape the imperative of "more and more" or deeply change our way of life. Annette Kehnel reveals that we once understood this very clearly. She takes us on a journey to the Middle Ages, where she discovers millennia-old human wisdom still relevant today in the teachings of the seven deadly sins. Each of the sins represents a condition of our human existence: luxuria (lust) relates to moderate consumption, avaritia (greed) to the understanding that ownership and wealth must be limited; ira (anger) addresses aggression and violence, invidia (envy) the flip side of competition, and superbia (pride) our pursuit of status and power.

This presents a surprisingly modern view of humanity aiming for balance, resonance, and harmony, offering a new perspective on our times and their challenges. The traditional wisdom contained in the teachings of the deadly sins provides a path for dealing with our destructive side. Kehnel uncovers this knowledge for the present day, showing how it can help us change ourselves and the world.

Eva Kienholz, born in 1987 in Heidelberg, studied German studies, history, and German literature in Mannheim and Berlin. She works as a journalist and freelance writer. In 2015, she began to extensively engage with the AfD and the New Right. Her book *Ihr Kampf. Wie Höcke & Co. die AfD radikalisieren* was published in 2020.

When the political party AfD (Alternative für Deutschland) was founded in February 2013 in a community hall in Oberursel, no one anticipated how much the 18 attendees would change Germany. Initially established as a fiscally conservative party, the AfD has since radicalized through several phases. While Bernd Lucke once considered how to withdraw from the Euro, Björn Höcke now advocates for the "remigration" of people with migrant backgrounds. Despite this, or perhaps because of it, the AfD has steadily gained favor with voters. In Saxony, Thuringia, and Brandenburg, it may become the strongest political force in the upcoming elections.

Eva Kienholz tracks the party's evolution, which has veered increasingly to the right and now openly seeks power in the country. This is an important book for understanding Germany's political landscape.

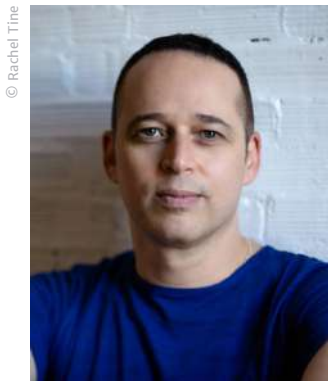

Ron Leshem, born in 1976 in Tel Aviv, is a novelist, screenwriter, and former Israeli intelligence officer. He works in Hollywood and Tel Aviv and has co-developed the internationally acclaimed series *Euphoria* and co-written the script for the series *No Man's Land*, among other projects. His novels *Der geheime Basar* and *Wenn es ein Paradies gibt* remained on the bestseller list in Israel for months. *Wenn es ein Paradies gibt* received Israel's prestigious Sapir Prize in literature and was adapted into a film titled *Beaufort*, which won the Silver Bear at the Berlinale and received an Oscar nomination. His latest work is *Als wir schön waren* (2022).

On October 7th, 2023, Hamas unleashed terror on Israel, and since then, the world has been holding its breath as events unfold rapidly. Peter R. Neumann, born in Würzburg in 1974, is Professor of Security Studies at King's College London, where he directed the International Centre for the Study of Radicalisation (ICSR) for many years. As an internationally sought-after expert, Neumann served as advisor to the USA at the United Nations in 2014. In 2017 he was special representative to the Organisation for Security and Co-operation in Europe (OSCE). He also writes for *Der Spiegel* and *The New York Times*, among others. His book *Die neuen Dschihadisten* was a bestseller.

Islamist terrorism has returned: October 7 has fueled the Middle East conflict more than anything else in recent decades. The nervous and indecisive reactions in Germany and Europe reflect the political landscape. Beneath that, a new movement targeting Israel and Jews is emerging, which is difficult to identify and stop. Sometimes it is possible, but often it is not.

Peter R. Neumann, a leading terrorism expert, says the jihadist threat is back – maybe even stronger than ten years ago. Since October 7, there have been eight attempted terrorist attacks in Europe, more than the entire previous year. Europe faces a new wave of jihadist attacks, this time targeting Jewish lives. This is a major challenge for the idea of Europe as a place where people of different backgrounds and religions can live together peacefully. Populists and right-wing extremists might also benefit politically from this wave of jihadist attacks.

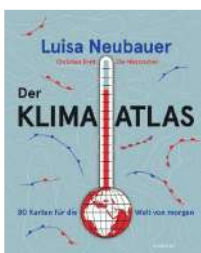

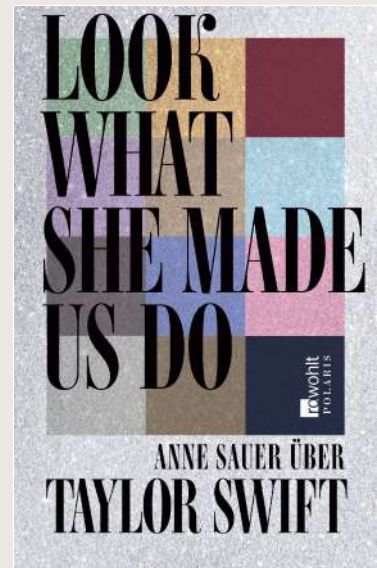

Oliver Fischer, born in 1970, studied German literature, art history, and Catholic theology. He works as a freelance journalist in Hamburg, contributing to publications such as *Geo Epoche* and *Merian*. In 2016, he founded the *Thomas Mann Society Hamburg*, of which he is the chairman.

"One cannot experience love more intensely", wrote Thomas Mann in 1943 about his relationship with Paul Ehrenberg. The two met in 1899 in a Munich salon. Ehrenberg was studying animal painting, while Mann was an editor at *Simplicissimus* working on his first novel, *Buddenbrooks*. Their meeting drew the reserved Mann out of his shell. Paul showed him the lively side of Munich, introducing him to coffee-houses and carnival balls in Schwabing.

Their close friendship lasted several years. Even after their paths diverged in 1933 – Paul stayed in Germany and adapted to the Nazis, while Mann went into exile – they remained significant to each other. Oliver Fischer details their life stories, which culminate in Mann's novel *Doctor Faustus*. In it, Mann immortalizes his love for Paul as the conflicted violinist Rudi Schwerdtfeger, who is killed by a jealous lover.

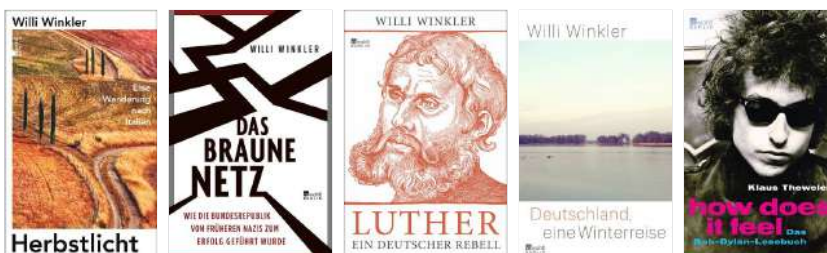

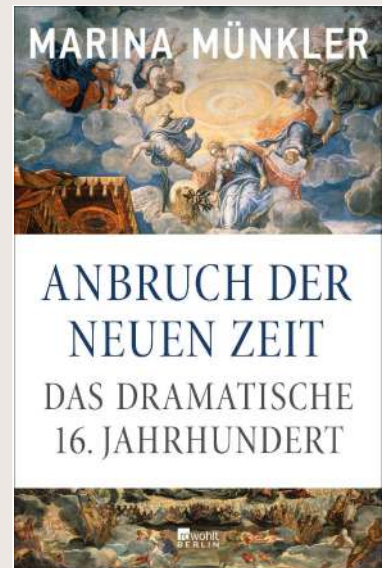

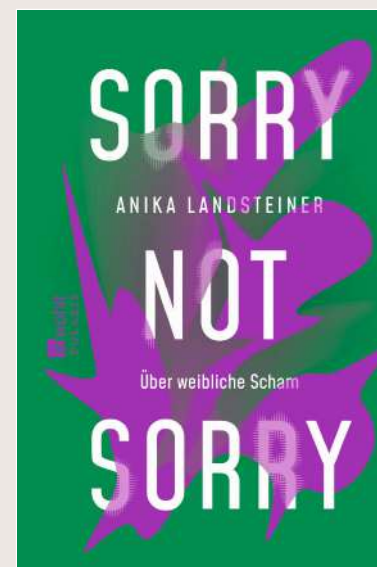
