

"Principles of Relevant Economics" is the name of the new book by Heiner Flassbeck. This book turns economics upside down. For the first time, without ideological blinkers, markets are consistently examined for their functioning within the framework of a dynamic development theory and fundamentally questioned, except for the majority of goods markets. Neither capital nor labour markets produce the results claimed by the vast majority of economists and assumed in all their economic policy recommendations. This book creates a completely new basis for economic policy.

Heiner Flassbeck was State Secretary from October 1998 to April 1999 at the Federal Ministry of Finance, Bonn, responsible for international affairs, the EU and IMF. He worked at UNCTAD since 2000; from 2003 to December 2012, he was director of the Division on Globalization and Development Strategies. Since January 2013 he is director of Flassbeck-Economics, a consultancy for global macroeconomic questions.
